2. All **stabling only** to be booked through **Addington** (through the website

Please designate 1 person per school to book stabling.

**Addington are not dealing with any show enquiries other than stabling.**

3. Only teams and individuals qualified for the championships are eligible to compete.

4. Please read rules carefully for each discipline.

5. The **Team Manager** is responsible for the conduct and welfare of their schools' horses, riders and other connected parties.(parents, supporters etc) at **all times** on the show ground.

6. **Directions** to Addington Manor and a list of local hotels and B&B's can be found on the Addington website

7. **No dogs** anywhere except car & lorry parks

8. **£10 deposit per stable on arrival**. Do not send with booking. This will be refunded when your stable is left clean before you leave. No refunds will be given after the event. If a deposit is not taken, any stable left dirty will result in a £10 charge. All hay & droppings must be removed. All stable bookings close a week before the show.

9. No BBQs or Chimneas in lorry park.

10. Hook ups to be arranged with Addington.

11. Include with your entries an A5 SAE. You will be sent security wristbands for competitors and all other persons attached to the team, which you will need to get into the show ground.

12. All jumping courses will be raised 5cm from the qualifiers, at the Championships.

13. In the event of cancellation, entry fees shall be returned on receipt of a SAE, less £5 per competitor per class to help cover costs.

14. **After 10p.m, the stable area should be quiet**. Please be aware that horses need to rest and therefore noise, lighting and intrusion should be kept to an absolute minimum. Late night checks should be conducted prior to 10p.m.

15. A contact number must be left on the stable door of every horse in case of an emergency.

**Horses may not arrive after 10pm and before 6a.m**

**Addington Manor Equestrian Centre reserves the right to refuse entry to, and remove, any individual without giving a reason.**

## Conditions of entry

In order to compete in events listed on the NSEA website, all competing schools must now be members of the NSEA, and show their membership number on entry forms. For full details of how to join go to [www.nsea.co.uk](http://www.nsea.co.uk)

Entries must be made in advance, late entries to be accepted at the discretion of the organisers.

The organisers reserve the right to refuse any entry, for any reason.

Competitors must wear correct clothing and tack in accordance with BD/BSJA/NSEA JwS rules.

Lungeing is not permitted in any working area.

The decision of the judges is final.

Children under 16 must be supervised at all times.

All riders MUST wear hard hats, correctly fitting and to the latest BSI specifications according to the rules with the chin strap done up whilst mounted. All dressage hats must have a fitted chin strap.

Any objections must be made to the organiser within 5 minutes of the completion of the event, in writing, accompanied by a deposit of £30 which may be forfeited if the objection is overruled.

The organisers shall not be liable for any claims in respect of damage or accident to any person, whether competitor, servant or spectator, horse, vehicle or property, howsoever caused in conjunction with or arising out of the show.

# **RULES FOR 2011 NSEA CHAMPIONSHIPS AT ADDINGTON OCTOBER 2011**

IN ORDER TO COMPETE IN ANY COMPETITIONS LISTED ON THE NSEA WEBSITE, SCHOOLS MUST BE A MEMBER OF THE NSEA, AND PUT THEIR MEMBERSHIP NUMBER ON THEIR ENTRY FORM

## **SPECIFIC**

### **SHOW JUMPING -TEAM & INDIVIDUAL CHAMPIONSHIPS**

#### **BSJA Rules (also see general rules)**

Riders who have competed beyond British Novice BSJA, are unable to compete at Mini level Show Jumping. Heights in the first round shall be as follows:

Mini – 75cm

Novice – 85cm

Intermediate – 95cm

Open – 1.05m

### **DRESSAGE**

#### **British Dressage Rules (also see general rules)**

**Prelim - restricted to horses with 49 BD points or less**

**Novice & Elementary- open to all**

### **JUMPING WITH STYLE – ARENA EVENTING**

#### **NSEA JwS Rules (as follows)**

1. This competition is run on the lines of B.E JAS competitions. The main difference is that the emphasis is more on the rider's **style and effectiveness**, and the **harmony between horse and rider** at school level. The style mark for the horse does not apply in Schools' Competitions, so the horse's ability has less influence in the marks.

Class 1 75cm Riders age 13 & under on 1st Jan 2011

Class 2 85cm - Open to riders who have not competed at BE pre-novice or higher prior to qualification

Class 3 95cm - Open to all except horse/rider combinations that have competed at BE JRN Champs, Junior or Pony Final Trials & Champs prior to qualification

Class 4 1.05-1.10m

2. The competition begins with a show jumping round started by a bell. The rider completes the timed show jumping section, then passes through a timing beam into the x.c. phase, which has an optimum time, and completes the x.c. phase. This all takes place in one arena. For speeds see table.

3. The winner will be the person / team with the fewest penalties once the following have been added together:

- s.j. jumping penalties
- x.c. jumping penalties
- x.c. time penalties
- overall style penalties (awarded for both s.j & x.c phases)

4. Style mark – for horse/rider combination, including the position and effectiveness of the rider, with the ability to show a difference between the s.j and x.c phase, through their style of riding. This will be judged by an accredited trainer or an elite rider.

5. The aim of the competition is to achieve the fewest penalties from the total of the four components – sj penalties, xc penalties, style and x.c speed (as close to the optimum time as possible). Some x.c. fences have a knock down top rail. If this is knocked down, 4 penalties will be added to the penalty score.

XC colours to be worn – incl body protector & skull cap to comply with BE Rules. Hats may be tagged by BE or Pony Club.

Hair to be worn above the collar. Gloves should be worn. No earrings or other visible piercings.

### **PENALTIES FOR S.J AND X.C PHASES OF JWS**

Knockdown	4 penalties
1st Refusal	4 penalties
2nd Refusal	8 penalties

3rd Refusal	Elimination
1st Rider Fall	8 penalties
2nd Rider Fall	Elimination
Horse Fall	Compulsory Retirement
Starting before the bell, Retaking an obstacle already jumped/ Error of course	Elimination
Every commenced second over the time allowed	1 penalty
Exceeding time limit (3times the time allowed)	Elimination

### **SPEED FOR SJ PHASE**

MINI – 300 m/m

NOVICE – OPEN = 325 m/m

### **SPEED FOR X.C. PHASE**

MINI – 325 m/m

NOVICE & INTERMEDIATE – 350 m/m

OPEN – 375 M/M

NOTE – NO STOP WATCHES ALLOWED

6. There will be a 2 minute warning given to riders not ready to jump, before elimination.

7. In the event of a tie, the competitor with the highest style mark (fewest style penalties) will be the winner. If still equal, the one closest to the optimum time will be the winner.

8. In team competitions, there will be no individual placings.

### **GENERAL RULES**

for SHOW JUMPING, DRESSAGE AND ARENA EVENTING (JwS)

#### **RULES FOR THE QUALIFYING ROUNDS & CHAMPIONSHIPS**

9. Balloting. If entries at regional qualifiers are over subscribed, balloting will take place in the following order : out of area teams, second & subsequent teams, individual second rides

10. The highest placed 2 teams and 2 individuals will qualify for the Championships. If they are unable to go to the Championships or have already qualified, the qualification will be passed down the line on the day (this can be offered down as far as 6th place at the judges' discretion.)

11. A school may qualify 2 teams for the Championships per class, but may only qualify 1 team per class per competition. No school sashes to be worn at prize giving's (sponsors request).

12. Should a school have two teams placed in the top 2 in a qualifying class, the next placed team down the line may qualify for the Championships, at the judge's discretion, (3rd place) or if any of the first 2 teams have already qualified 2 teams.

13. Each team at the Championships must include two out of the original qualified four horse/rider combinations. A Team Manager may then have up to 2 wild card substitutions providing they fulfill the following criteria:

a) The horse/rider combination must have successfully completed a NSEA Competition in the same year or a NSEA, B.E or BSJA competition at the same level or above.

b) A team may qualify with a team of only 3 riders, then take a fourth as 1 wild card, providing they fulfill the above criteria ( see a)

c) If a team rider is eliminated at a qualifier and their team goes on to qualify, they may not compete at the Championships unless they successfully complete at another NSEA competition, at the same level or above and their entry is sent with an authorizing letter from their Team Manager.

14. Objections must be made by the Team Manager only, within 5 minutes of the end of the class, in writing, with a £30 deposit. Video/photographic evidence is not admissible.

15. Only the Team Manager (Team Trainer, Supporting Teacher, Riding Captain or the appointed responsible adult for that school) of each school is to deal with the Secretary. ( for declarations, enquiries, objections etc)

16. Declarations to be made 10 minutes before the start of each class, by the Team Manager.

17. For confirmation of entries at qualifiers, please check individual websites. For the Championships, please check the NSEA website. If you do not wish for your child's name to be posted on the website, please write on your entry form and confirm with the secretary.

18. At the Championships, the fences are 5cm higher from the qualifying rounds. The fences will be raised again in the jump off.

#### **19. RIDERS**

i) **All riders must be in full time education at the school or college they represent in 2011 (age U19 on 1st Jan 2011.) with the following exceptions.**

**A) A rider who changes schools in 2011 can only then compete for their new school, unless they qualified for their previous school for the 2011 Championships prior to moving schools.**

**B) If a rider qualifies for one school, then changes school, they should ride at the Championships for the original school unless they also qualify for their new school, in which case they must compete for the new school.**

ii) A rider may only compete for one school at the Championships.

iii) A rider may not compete in both mini and open classes.

iv) If a rider (age 13 & under 1st Jan 2011) starts the year as a mini, qualifies at mini then progresses and qualifies later in the year at open height on any horse, they will automatically forfeit their mini qualification.

v) Combinations of horse and rider may only compete in 2 teams per discipline per qualifier.

vi) A rider may only compete once in any team, therefore cannot compete two horses in the same team.

vii) If a horse/rider combination wins an individual class at the Championship, they may compete in a team at a lower height the following year, but are unable to qualify individually for any height lower than the one they won at.

#### **20. HORSES**

a) A horse may only compete in two classes at each qualifier, once in each class & height.

b) Any horse competing at 1m-1.05m may not also compete in the 70cm class.

c) No horse may be ridden by two different riders in the same class.

d) Horses to be plaited at the Championships.

e) No horse may compete twice in the same class at a qualifier or the Championships.

21. The organizers and judges reserve the right to penalize by elimination any of the following.

A) Any rider they feel to be unsafe or using unnecessary force.

B) Any horse that looks unsound or unduly distressed or poses a danger to other competitors and spectators.

C) Outside assistance which may benefit the rider unfairly.
